Friendly Reminder!

Membership Eligibility

There are two qualifiers for membership in the VFW, as set out in our National Bylaws. An indi-vidual must meet both in order to become a member. They are as follows:

- 1: Honorable Service must have served in the Armed Forces of the United States and either received a discharge of Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) or be currently serv-ing.
- 2: Service in a war, campaign, or expedition on foreign soil or in hostile waters*. This can be proven by any of the following:
 - An authorized campaign medal (see a full list of qualifying medals and badges)
 - Receipt of Hostile Fire Pay or Imminent Danger Pay (verified by a military pay statement)
 - Service in Korea for 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days

*This information is usually available through a veteran's DD-214. If other information is needed or if a veteran's DD-214 is not complete, they can contact the National Personnel Records Center online or at 314.801.0800 to request more information.

If you are not eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars but you have a parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, sibling, or spouse who would be eligible then you may apply for membership in the VFW Auxiliary. You can learn more at vfwauxiliary.org.

It has been a while since we have had a newsletter.

Important information for Vietnam Veterans!!!! There are 3 new presumptive conditions added to the list for herbicide exposure. They are Bladder Cancer, Parkinsonism, and Hypothyroidism. If you are a boots on the ground or a blue water navy vet and have been diagnosed with any of these conditions, it is presumed under law, that it is due to herbicide exposure from military service. You may file a claim if you have a medical diagnosis. You may contact me @ 636-928-4969 or you can contact our VFW department service officers @ 314-253-4470. Their office is in the old records center @ 9700 Page Ave. You must call for an appointment.

Also pending in congress is house bill HR 1972. If this bill gets signed into law they will recognize Hypertension and Monoclonal Gammopathy also known as MGUS and be added to the herbicide list. If you are a Vietnam Veteran you eligible to sign up for VA healthcare. Call J.C. hospital @3 14-652-4100 and ask for the operator to give you eligibility. They will sign you up and get you assigned a primary care provider.

The Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans have 3-new presumptive conditions. The conditions are Sinusitis, Rhinitis, and Asthma. You must be diagnosed within 10 years of a qualifying period of military service. For more details contact me or our VFW dept service officers. Iraq and Afghanistan Vets are eligible for 5 years VA health care from date of separation from military service. The other way to qualify for healthcare is by low income, or if you have a service connected disability. We are working on getting a date set for a service officer event. We will let you know when it is scheduled.



April 3, 2022. Kids up to age 10 will visit with the Easter Bunny, play games for prizes and hunt for Easter eggs.



It has been a while since we have sent out The Informer, but we are back. This is a word from your VFW post 2866 surgeon general. Winter is trying to get its foot in the door, as things start to go back to a precovid normal, businesses etc. dropping mask mandates and going back to group gatherings it is important to not forget that Flu, Pneumonia, and just the common cold are still out here as well. So, make sure you are still getting your flu shot, taking vitamins to boost those immune systems, washing your hands and using hand sanitizer to help keep you healthy this winter.

I also wanted to inform of a new responsive treatment for Covid. It is available to people who are high risk. This is an I.V. antibody treatment; you can receive with a positive covid test. The treatment stops covid from progressing in your body, hoping to prevent you from getting to the point where you could possibly end up in the hospital. It is important that if you qualify for this treatment, you do it as soon as you can. I will provide some locations below on where they provide this treatment. Also, if you have questions about the I.V. treatments your general family doctors should be aware of locations as well that offer this treatment. The treatment is also available to any caretakers that are helping take care of you personally as well.
